EOF and LAF Fundraiser—Accessorize!

Our September 13th meeting at the Forest Oaks I Clubhouse will feature a Potluck Dinner and "Shape the Future": Silent Auction Fundraiser for the Educational Opportunities Fund (EOF) and Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF). New members may join at the meeting for \$36.00, one-half price of the usual dues.

The theme for the auction will be "Accessorize!" You may be the successful bidder on exciting accessories that you can add to enhance your outfits – scarves, jewelry, belts, purses, hats, gloves, socks. *Non-theme items, as always, are welcome.*Starting thinking of what your colleagues might like to bid on, and donate items to benefit AAUW in the following ways. The **Educational Opportunities Fund** provides financial support to advance education, research, and self development for women to foster equity and positive social change. Funds target grants for specific fellowships, career development, community action, and selected professions awards. Each year the Educational Fund provides more than four million dollars in fellowships and grants to support women scholars.

The **Legal Advocacy Fund** provides legal support to protect LAF plaintiffs in workplace sex discrimination cases. The campus Outreach Project protects college students from discrimination, harassment, and assault through ongoing program grants. Since 1981 more than two million dollars has been contributed to assist plaintiffs with legal fees for sex discrimination cases.—*Edna Burke, Development*

Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Program

For many years, the Murfreesboro Branch of AAUW has adopted the Rutherford County Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Program, contributing goods and sometimes cash to the program at our monthly meetings. The branch is very fortunate to have the agency's director, Deborah Johnson, as a member and branch officer.

In 2011 the Domestic Violence Program completed twenty-five years of service in Rutherford and Cannon Counties as an independent 501 (C)(3) non-profit agency. Director Johnson, says, "I am proud our organization has increased its services to victims of domestic violence to include not only the original 24 hour crisis line, shelter, and counseling services but also court advocacy, specialized children's services, and community support groups." Johnson has also promoted the agency and increased its scope of programming to include Elder Abuse programming and sexual assault services. The agency has moved from a \$43,000 budget and staff of three to an annual operating budget of over \$700,000 and twenty full and part time victims' advocates. As an adjunct professor at Middle Tennessee State University, Johnson shares knowledge about social work, elder abuse, and domestic violence with university students. She also works closely with community leaders, local social services agencies, and law enforcement.

"I have enjoyed my relationship with AAUW members," says Johnson. "I am very grateful of all the support AAUW has provided the program. I believe strongly that 'love shouldn't have to hurt' and have worked to better our community."

To learn more about current issues facing the Rutherford County Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Program, be sure to attend the branch meeting on October 11, 5:00 PM, Central Christian Church. **October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month.** An act of domestic violence occurs every 12 seconds in the United States, and most victims are women.

Ruth Houston Scholar. 2012-2013

Rita Jane Jones is the 2012-2013 recipient of the Ruth Houston Scholarship, a \$1,000 per semester academic scholarship that the Murfreesboro Branch of AAUW awards annually to an undergraduate MTSU student.

A mother of two adult daughters, Rita is a Communication Studies major. As a nontraditional student, she says, "Claiming my education is changing my life. I finally have the tools I need to put together all these threads I have accumulated through my years. Understanding how much I do not know has opened so many doors for me. In 2008 when I returned to school, I began a journey of re-inventing Rita. I was not at all sure I could sit in class, take notes, pass a test—I was not sure the other students would accept 'an older student' in their class. These fears and concerns melted away within the first 'Hello' I received from my English instructor. Every semester has built courage, determination, and a confidence I have never known."

"To be awarded the Ruth Houston Memorial Scholarship with AAUW," Rita says, "is an honor and opportunity that I humbly accept for myself and for all women who may find themselves in need of reinventing. With this very generous scholarship, with the wisdom and guidance of AAUW, I will continue my studies at MTSU so I may truly help make a difference in the equality for women in our education systems, our households—indeed, in every work place in America. Thank you to the AAUW, Murfreesboro Branch for this honor."
